Titanic: Captain's Table

Students train to become a maid or waiter onboard the 'unsinkable' *Titanic*. A costumed mail or waiter will put students through their paces as they learn appropriate table manners and Edwardian etiquette. In groups they will design fantasy first Class menus before attempting to set the Captain's Table for dinner.
