

Teacher Information: What to Expect on the Day

What to wear

Students and accompanying adults should be suitably dressed in warm, waterproof clothing and sensible footwear

What to bring

Lunch facilities are available to pre-book. If you are not staying for lunch, please ask the students to bring a snack to break up the visit. Photography is allowed, so students are welcome to bring a camera with them. Please remember to bring your signed code of conduct.

Access

There is disabled parking, a coach drop-off point and level access out onto the quayside. Two gangways allow wheelchair access to the main deck of *Glenlee*. There is a lift on board allowing access to most areas, with crew on hand to assist. Disabled toilet facilities are available onboard. On arrival

There is a coach drop-off point situated outside the Riverside Museum's front entrance. Ask your driver to drop your class here. There are coach parking facilities available by arrangement, so please mention this when booking. If you are running late, please phone to let us know.

The teacher and group leaders should escort students out around the left side of the Riverside Museum until reaching the south entrance.

The class will be met at the Tall Ship *Glenlee* glass ticket pavilion by the session facilitator. Please allow 5 minutes walking time from the coach drop-off point to the ship.

Gift Shop and Cafe

Should students wish to purchase a souvenir of their visit to *Glenlee*, we do have a small gift shop on the ship. The café sells a selection of food should anyone forget to bring along their packed lunch on the day.

Behaviour

Our learning team are facilitators only. It is the responsibility of the accompanying adults to ensure children are supervised at all times and not allowed to run about or act in a manner that may be dangerous. All groups should have adequate supervision, on a ratio of at least 1 adult for every 8 children between the ages of 5 to 16 years, and 1 adult for every 5 children under 5 years.
